<b>Topic</b>	<b>Program</b>
Innovations in organic agriculture	Visit to several organic rice farms in Camargue Regional Park (region located east of Montpellier in the Rhône estuary)
Innovating by simplifying: developing short circuits	Visit to several producers who have chosen short-circuit strategies: local markets, direct sales, producer associations.
Innovating collectively to develop new quality markets	Visit to wine cooperatives in Languedoc to discuss their adaptation strategies in the face of increasing global competitiveness.
Innovating to maintain traditions	Visit to Roquefort cheese cellars and discussion with those involved in the promotion of registered designation of origin (AOC) and rural development.
Innovation in peri-urban areas	Visit to actors involved in peri-urban land planning, short walk to an overlook for a landscape interpretation.
